Knowing there was a layoff at your organization or place of work, can feel HEAVY.


Suvivors Guilt usually kicks in and paranoia can also be triggered.

Some examples of Solidarity.




Hiring processes usually take weeks sometimes a month and sometimes MONTHS. The lay off process can happen almost immediately.
